AMAZING ADVENTURES/WILD WILDLIFE

Dear Parents/carers,

Welcome back. I hope you had a relaxing Easter holiday and were able to enjoy some of the sunshine in amongst all the rain. The topic for this half term is called Wild Wildlife and Amazing Adventures. We will be focusing on the jungle habitats and animals. A topic map is attached so you can see the activities and learning objectives we will be covering in more detail.

Mystery reader

Last year Buttercups really valued and were thrilled by the mystery reader sessions. We are hoping to run these again this year. Every week a different parent can sign up and come in to read a story of their choice to Buttercups. You might want to choose one of your child's favourite books. A timetable to sign up can be found in the office with Mrs Rigby. Alternatively please speak to Miss Batty or I and we can sign you up for the slot.

If you sign up for a slot please don't tell your child as it will be a greater surprise for them and create more of a buzz about reading for the class. You can choose any book to read. It has been fun to hear new stories that we have not read to the children. If you speak another language in addition to English, it would be wonderful if you could read a story in your home language. Mystery reader sessions are every Tuesday afternoon at 3pm.

Name writing

The children are gaining confidence in using and remembering to write their surnames. We will continue to practise this during this summer term.

PE Kits

We will be holding some PE sessions outside this half term. Please could you check that your child has trainers and an outside jumper to wear outside during PE?

Warm Weather Preparation

As summer approaches and the warm weather arrives please could you make sure your child brings a water bottle, sun hat and sun-cream to school. I will make sure they reapply any sun-cream before lunch time. It is still important that they bring rain jackets, especially as the rain can be unpredictable in the summer and Buttercup class will be holding more learning sessions outside.

Lost Uniform

I have been encouraging the children to hang their cardigans and jumpers up on their pegs as soon as they take them off. Unfortunately sometimes they still do leave them on the floor. Please gently remind them about putting their belongings on their pegs. Many of the name labels are now very faint and it is extremely difficult to tell who the jumper/cardigan belongs to. Please check the labels on your child's clothing and reapply their names if needed. I have a growing pile of unclaimed jumpers and cardigans with no names on them. They are hanging up near the Buttercup garden door next to the waterproof garden suits. Please feel free to have a look and take any you feel are yours.
