

This is a planning format and is subject to change according to the children's needs and interests.

Geography

To further develop locational knowledge, focussing on naming the counties and cities in the region in which we live, East Anglia. We will also investigate land use and discover why the land is good for farming and how this has changed over the years. Children will also carry out a river study and learn about the water cycle.

Science Earth, Sun and Moon.

Children will learn that the Earth, sun and moon are approximately spherical bodies. They will learn about the movement of the Earth, sun and moon. Children will be able to name, order and describe features of the planets in our solar system. They will understand how the rotation of the Earth explains day and night.
