Overview	 The Pupil Premium is designed to ensure that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most. The funding is allocated to Local Authorities and schools with pupils from Reception to Y11 who are eligible for free school meals (FSM), are looked after or have parents currently in the Armed Forces. In 2017/18 the funding allocated is £1,320 per child, £300 for children of Armed Forces families. From April 2012 the coverage of the Premium was widened to include those eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years. Premium Plus was introduced with a higher rate of funding of £1,900 for Looked after children (LAC) Children adopted from care Children who leave care under a special guardianship order or residence order
