Dear Parents and Carers

We had a really wonderful response to the Readathon. A fantastic £1527.41 was raised through sponsorship money and together with the World Book Day donations, we have a total of £1614.94 to put towards the library. Thank you all so much - please do thank the friends and family who sponsored the children. Many of them have really enjoyed the reading challenge and it's something we will definitely do again.

It is so lovely seeing the children using the library all the time. Each class throughout the school has dedicated library time each week and the Year 5 librarians, with the supervision of a teaching assistant, run sessions on 3 lunchtimes each week where the Key Stage 2 children can come and browse and change their books. The Junior Librarian software we have makes it easy for children to log books in and out and they are starting to use it to add reviews and recommendations. It is such a wonderful resource to have.

I have now analysed the responses to the parent questionnaire that so many of you were kind enough to complete during the parents' evenings. The results are interesting and are attached with this Airwaves. We are delighted that almost everyone agrees or strongly agrees that we are good at keeping parents informed!

E-safety

Thank you to all parents who completed our online e-safety survey. This has helped us to understand how the children use the internet outside of school and tailor advice we can offer them and you. Children in upper key stage 2 have completed their own survey and this has also given us an insight into their use of the internet.

We have been reassured that most families limit their children's internet access to devices used within a family room and that they have spoken to their children about staying safe online. Most children access the internet for home learning activities or to play games. As children get older, some are accessing the internet using their phone when they are away from their family. Did you know that Instagram uses geolocation and can show where your child is when a message is sent? Some children also access the internet at friends' houses so it is important that your child knows what to do should they be exposed to content that may be filtered at your own house.
