Dear parents/carers,

Welcome back! We hope you have enjoyed a lovely Christmas break and your child is raving to go in this short and important term.

Our topic this term is 'East Anglia and the Rives Cam.' Your child will learn about the region in which we live and where it is in the British Isles. Children will also investigate how the land is used and study different types of farming. In addition, they will learn about the crops produced in our region and the importance of eating a wide variety of different nutrients found in different food types. We will end the topic with a river study and will consider the effects of global warming on our planet. Additionally, we will be looking at the work of Frank Averback in art lessons and we will be studying 'Floodland' by Marcus Sedgwick in our English lessons. As well as spellings and Times Tables Rockstars, children will also continue to be given Guided Reading home learning each Friday and this must be returned on Mondays.

Later this term, you will be invited to attend a meeting which will introduce the Year 6 SATs and you can keep up-to-date with other important events and updates via the school website and the Airwaves newsletter. The date for this meeting is Wednesday 23" February.
