Dear Parents and Carers

Thank you for supporting the Book Fair this week - and thanks to Year 6 for running it so efficiently! We will let you know next week how much we have raised in commission.

We enjoyed meeting our new parents for September on Wednesday evening, and our new children have started coming into school for story sessions. Next Wednesday they will be spending the morning in the Reception classroom and sampling their first school lunch - a very important part of the school day!

We are delighted to be able to let you know that from September our school catering will be run 'in-house', so our fantastic catering staff of Tina, Jo and Simon will become school employees and part of our school team. School lunches will continue to be cooked on the premises and we will continue to develop meals and menus that are both popular and nutritious. We are also planning some refurbishments to the school kitchen during the summer holidays in preparation for the new school year.

For the last three weeks of term, there may be some changes to the published menus as Cambridgeshire Catering Services wind down their operation here. We would also ask you to bear with us when we start back in September as there will be lots of new procedures in place. Going forward though, this promises to be a great step forward for our school catering provision.

There will be no hot school meal on sports day, so the children will all need to bring a packed lunch to eat on the field. If you would like to book a packed lunch provided by the school catering service (this only applies if your child normally receives a free school meal) please request this from the office by Thursday 5th July. Afternoon school will continue as normal. On Sports Day the children will need a sun-hat and a T-shirt in their house colour: Hurricane = Red, Concorde = Green, Spitfire = Blue. Lancaster is normally a yellow T-shirt but for the children's comfort (black bugs are attracted to yellow!) we would prefer them to wear white for Sports Day. The children will have prepared house colour bunting and flags. Can any parents help on Sports Day - e.g. giving out the cards for 1st, 2nd in the races? Please ask at the office if you can.
